Disciplined Upgrading Process

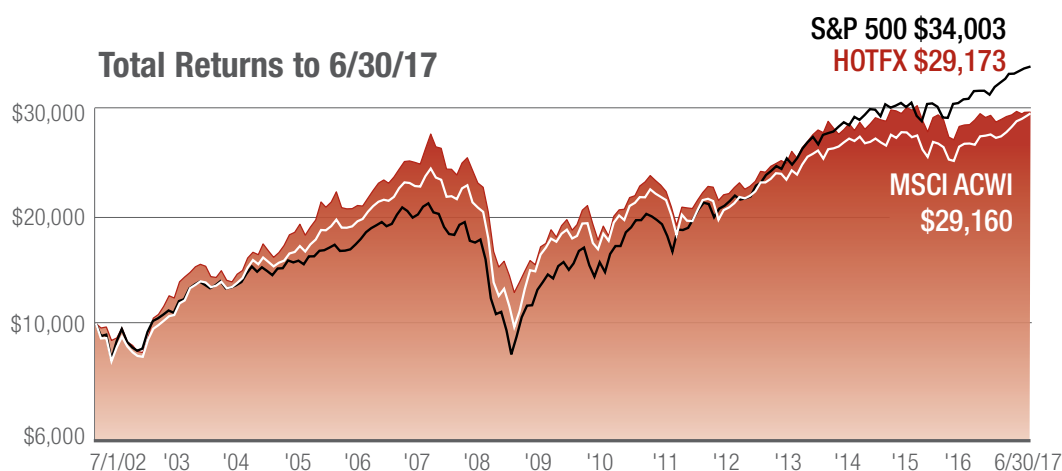
- We rank hundreds of funds and ETFs by FundX Score, our proprietary scoring system.

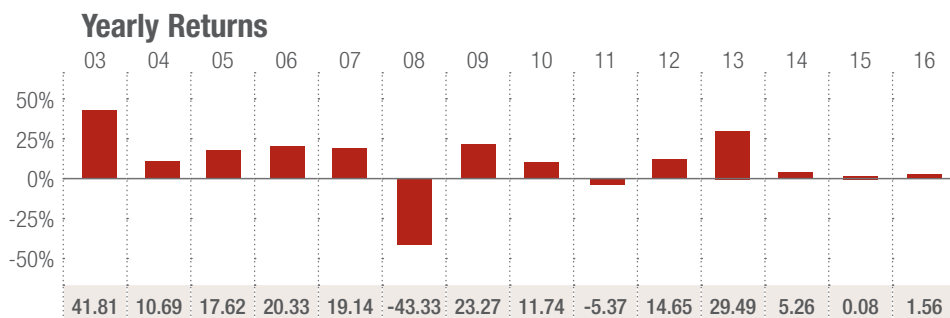
